He started his artistic activity in the 1920s by training as textile designer and by practising photography.

At the age of 20, he was interested for painting.

In 1934 he joined the photographic group "Abstraction-Création" in Paris.

Veronesi was also active in theatre and cinema. From the 1940s, he worked as scenographer, in particular in works of Luigi Pirandello, and later built several sets for the Scala Theater of Milan until the end of the 1980s.

After World War II, he was the co-founder of the photographic group "La Bussola".

Luigi Veronesi was a polyvalent and eclectic artist who managed to synthesise the avant-garde movements of various regions of Europe.

You can find his abstract works in museums all over the world.

Luigi Veronesi and his wife have been guests of the Hotel Rosalpina in San Cassiano, home of Josef Pizzinini, for about 40 years. For this reason we wanted to dedicate him a room.
